DUST ORDINANCE PASSED

Neighbors, it has taken a year and a half but we now have a dust control ordinance. Some of the more important points are:

1. Whoever clears an area is responsible for controlling the dust and whoever buys the area assumes the responsibility;
2. Within the prescribed limits the dust is to be controlled up to wind speeds of 28 MPH. If wind speed exceeds 28 MPH, control cannot stop but must continue at the 28 MPH level. Control efforts are required 24 hours per day, seven days per week, all year long;
3. An approved dust control plan is required before a construction permit can be issued;
4. The monitoring and enforcement responsibility is assigned to the Department of Environmental Health. The Department has the authority to issue citations for violations. The penalty for a violation is up to \$300 per day each day of violation. The permit can be revoked for continued serious violations.

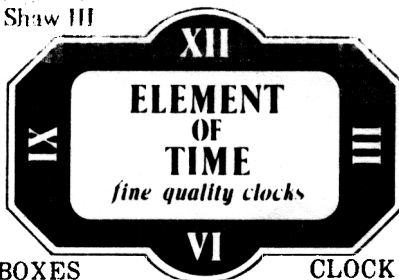

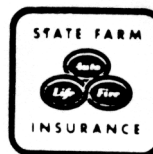
