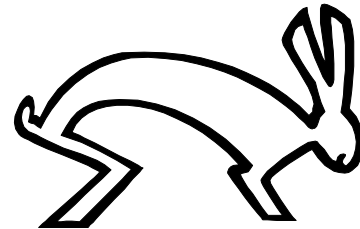

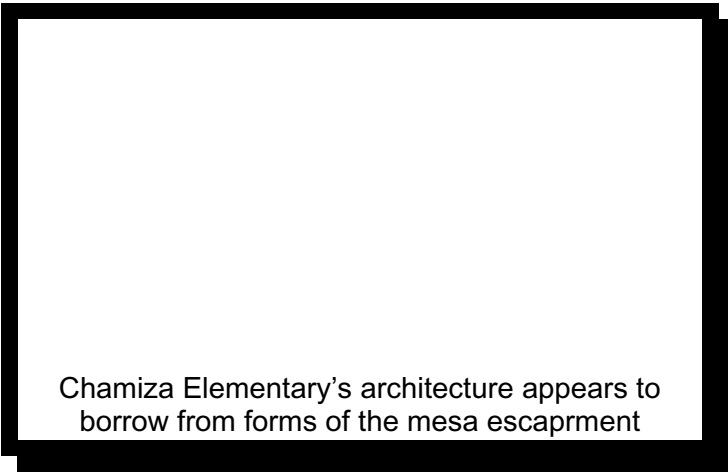

There will be road arterial improvements done on Montañño Road from Taylor Ranch

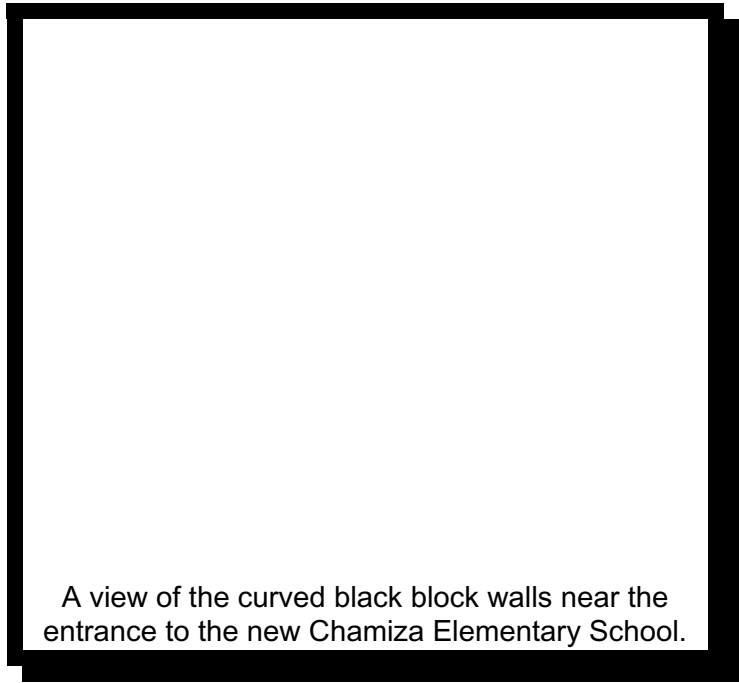
Drive to Coors. Work should be completed by October.

The following zoning changes have been requested:

- R-1 to RT at La Mariposa Addition, Block B, Lots 1-3 for townhouses at Windmill Manor (the property is west of Valle Vista between Alberta and Dellyne.)
- The Board opposed a zoning change request for a 500-unit apartment complex and a small commercial center C-1 on the property south of Wagon Trail and west of Coors.
- Las Mercadas II has made a request to subdivide parcel H-6A with Tract A into seven (7) parcels. The property is located at Paseo del Norte and Golf Course in the northeast section. ☺

## Environmental Committee

Members of the Environmental Committee recently met with Rob McNary with the City of Albuquerque Parks and General Services/Design and Development Department. The City intends to spend \$90,000 for a beautification project of the medians on Montañño Boulevard, between Taylor Ranch Road and Unser Boulevard. The purpose of the meeting was to obtain input from the neighborhood regarding the types of plants, trees, and shrubs we would like included in the plan. They must be xeriscape plants. The survey work has been completed. They hope to begin work in the Fall of 1995. We will continue to have meetings with the City as the plans progress. We would love to hear from you about any ideas you would like considered.

This is the season for weed control. How many of you have friends or family members with allergy problems? Did you know that it is against city ordinance to have weeds more than

four inches tall on or near your property? Article 9-8-4 of the Weed and Litter Ordinance reads as follows:

“It shall be unlawful for any owner of any occupied or unoccupied lot or tract of land within the city to permit or maintain on any such lot or tract of land, including the area located between the property line and the middle of the alley line and the curb, the area of any curbs or sidewalk located on the property, and the area located ten feet outside the property line where there is no curb, any growth of weeds to a greater height than four inches, or any accumulation of weeds.”

In other words, if you are a homeowner whose back property line backs up to a path or sidewalk, you are responsible for maintaining the weeds within ten feet of your property line too. IF we all do our part we can help make Albuquerque a healthier and cleaner place to live.

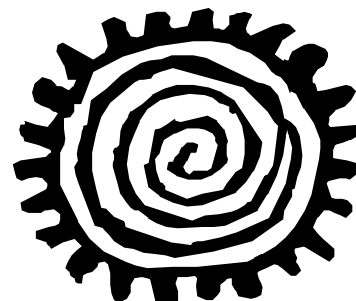
