A petition was circulated to oppose a zone change request for alcohol sales at the **Circle-K** store located at Taylor Ranch and Paseo del Norte. The zone change hearing took place on June 20th. The surrounding neighborhood associations are concerned about another 24-hour store that sells alcohol.

A "Paseo Now" rally was held on June 15th. Elected representatives, candidates and members of westside neighborhood

Are the Fungus Among Us?

Theories vary on how lawns get diseased. The disease becomes active when day or night temperatures reach 70°, depending on how much moisture and humidity your lawn receives - this will determine if, or how bad the problem will be. A good rule of thumb is: don't water grass in the late afternoon or evening hours. It is best to water in the early morning. When this is not possible, try to water before late afternoon, when the temperatures start to drop. Lawns that are stressed by lack of water, fertilizer, mowing or aeration, are more susceptible to fungus attack.

Under-fertilization and excessive thatch build-up will also breed certain fungi. A good fertilization and de-thatching program will inhibit the growth of fungus. Now is not the time to be fertilizing. You will fry your grass.

If the lawn contracts fungus in July because of the hot temperatures, apply a liquid fungicide 2-3 times for effective control. You may want to take a sample (approximately 8"x8" roots and all) to a nursery for assistance in determining the type of fungus and the best cure. A couple of recommended fungicides are Fertilime Liquid Fungicide or Ortho Multi-Purpose Fungicide.

Petroglyph Park & Paseo Extension

Several years ago in a city far, far away, a group of folks (U. S. Congress) got together, scribbled some lines on a paper, wrote up a bunch of legislation, and boom the Petroglyph National Monument was born. The formation of the Monument was a joint effort by the city, state and feds and involved many of the neighborhoods in the area. **TRNA** and our friends in Paradise Hills were particularly active in the process.

Paradise Hills Civic Association has taken a position that the park should be defunded and if Congress feels we need a Petroglyph Monument that it should be put down in Otero County. (Three Rivers). Without putting words in **PHCA's** mouth, they just don't consider the Monument to be a good neighbor. **PHCA's** biggest contention is over the extension of Paseo del Norte. Most of my career has been spent dealing with Montañño Bridge and I have left Paseo to Paradise Hills. (although we both support both projects). Although Paseo

extension would not serve many people within Taylor Ranch, it's absence would have a tremendous impact on us. Paseo will link up with Unser (middle) and also go out to Double Eagle II airport.

Unser was designed in conjunction with Paseo. Let's assume for a minute that Unser is completed to Southern Blvd. in Rio Rancho. Now let's imagine traffic flowing out of Rio Rancho heading for points south of Montañño. (Let's also assume Montañño is completed over the river.) Without Paseo extension, guess where ALL that traffic will end up? Because of the bend north and the reduced speed, many of those vehicles will flow down Montañño and Dellyne. Enough said about that. I think you can see why we favor a Paseo extension.

The board of directors would like to get your opinion on how the park service is managing the park. In essence we are trying to find out how you feel about our neighbor to the west. Please take a moment to jot down a few thoughts and send them to Dave Otto (use the space below). ☺
