The answer is yes, the property was purchased by the city and is the future site of a community center. I was commenting to another board member that if we got everyone to buy a bag of Quickcrete, a few 2X4's and some wall board, we could have an old fashion barn raising. However, I'm sure various government agencies would object to ordinary citizens taking things into their own hands. In all seriousness, now that we have the property it is time to start working on getting the funds to build up a building. The best place to get this money is the state legislature. I would urge of all you to contact Rep. Tim Macko and Sen. Joe Carraro. Since this is in their districts, they are the ones who would have to propose the money. For those of you who live in Phil Malloof's district, I would urge you to contact him to support the effort.

The last few months have been relatively quiet with respect to new developments and such. However, as the weather starts to warm up we will see start to see some action. The city is actively encouraging "infill". In most cases this is fine, but I would urge all of you to keep a lookout in your own neighborhoods for the little yellow signs that pop up on vacant land. The city is required to notify the association about these zoning requests but the folks that are most closely impacted are still the best source of information. The best time to get involved is when you see the request not when they start the new 200 unit apartment complex in the vacant lot across the street.

As the spring approaches it is once again time for TRNA elections. It certainly has gone by fast. Perhaps because I did not spend the whole summer attending city council meetings. We will have our annual meeting on March 18th and we will be electing six board members to two-year terms and two members to 1 year terms. We have three current board members who have said they want to continue. So that makes room for lots of new folks. Basically, if you have seven friends, the eight of you can stage your own little (hopefully bloodless) coup. If you are interested in serving your community and can spare a few hours a month, I would urge you to get involved.
