Waste Management Recycling Tours

The City's Waste Management Department and Public Works Department will provide special public guided tours to their recycling facilities during the week of Earth Day in April. The tours to the Cerro Colorado Landfill, Intermediate Recycling Processing Facility, and Soils Amendment (composting) Facility on the West Side will be on Tuesday and

Wednesday April 22nd and 23rd from 8 a.m. to noon. Each tour, limited to 35 people, will depart promptly at 8 a.m. from the Solid Waste offices, 4600 Edith NE. For further information and to make reservations, call the Solid Waste Recycling Hotline, 761-8176, TTY 761-8119.

Safe Streets '97

If you haven't noticed the numerous flashing police car lights on the highways or related articles in the news, you should be aware that the Mayor's office has increased police attention to speeding by city and state police. Be careful or you're likely to get a ticket. Here's some information from Neighborhood News:

A recently-designed brochure explaining the Safe Driver Pledge is available at many City facilities...when you turn in your pledge, you will receive a bumper sticker and additional driver information. Look for forms at any Police substation, City community center, City Hall information desk, Office of Neighborhood Coordination, or the Mayor's office.

Safe Streets was prompted by many calls about speeding in neighborhoods, disregard for traffic signals and signs and

lack of courtesy evidenced by so-called road rage incidents. *(ed. I've see and felt action on the highways but nothing in our neighborhoods.)* There will be increased enforcement of traffic laws by APD and State Police. A combination of local funding and over \$329,000 of federal and State funds will provide for the additional resources needed by the Safe Streets effort.

The Mayor stated that officers will also be pulling over drivers who are courteous and who watch out for safety by yielding the right of way, letting in traffic and other small acts of kindness that ensures safe traffic flow. These drivers will be given "Courtesy Coupons," including passes to the Rio Grande Zoo and Aquarium or coupons for free fast food and drinks. So if you're stopped and you don't know why, you now have a small hope that you'll get something other than a ticket! ®

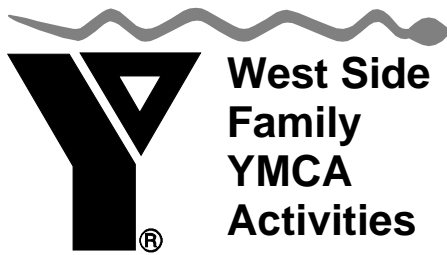
