Planned Growth Town Hall Meeting

Nextel Proposes Eyesore TRNA Recommends Against

Nextel is proposing placement of a cell tower behind Allsup's at Homestead Hills Shopping Center. The proposal is a 50-foot tower with a top similar to the tower on the south side of Montaño approaching Unser.

TRNA discussed how this outdated cell tower design is an eyesore and that cell towers now try to blend into the community by using existing structures or designs that are not immediately identifiable as towers.

TRNA is communicating that this design is not acceptable and that Nextel should explore potential sites where there are already high structures to which the antennae could mount, such as the LBJ Middle School roof or a flagpole. [By J. Wolfley]

Auto Repair Shop at NE Corner of Unser & Western Trail Proposed TRNA Requests Additional Design Elements

An auto repair shop (no bodywork) is being proposed for a parcel at the northeast corner of Unser and Western Trail. The use is allowed, only the site design is under review with the EPC in June.



thought the design was good quality. The building has windows on the Unser side and will be tans and browns to blend with the open space escarpment across the street.

TRNA requested subtle signage on Unser to maintain the natural landscape and non-business 'feel' of this area. The site will be well landscaped and TRNA requested high desert landscaping and no ornamental trees. The site also uses walls to screen parking and work bays. TRNA requested that the walls be split face block and non-white colors to discourage graffiti. [By J. Wolfley]

Summertime Crime Prevention Tips

This is usually the time of year that many of us choose to travel to see family and friends as well as enjoy a vacation. The following tips for securing your residence and travel safety should be observed before and during a trip.

Securing Your Residence and Preparing for Travel – Reduce Criminal Opportunity:

- · Ask a trusted neighbor to watch your residence and report suspicious activity.
- If possible, have a trusted friend or family member stay at your home.
- Install automatic timers on lights, TV's and radios to give the impression someone is home.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If you have a rollout trash dumpster, have a neighbor place it in the street on pick up day and return it that evening. Also ask them to park a vehicle in the driveway when ever possible.
- Be extra cautious about locking all doors and windows.
- Unplug your garage door opener.
- Make sure trees and shrubs are trimmed to allow for good natural surveillance of your property.
- Make arrangements to have exterior lights on each night.
- Each entrance should have a solid core or metal doors and deadbolt locks.
- Let neighbors, family and friends know when you plan to return from a trip.

Travel and Hotel/Motel Safety:

- Always be aware of your surroundings and trust your instincts.
- Lock all personal items in the trunk or away from view roll up windows, lock doors and take your keys.
- Park in well lit areas with a lot activity. Park as close to an entrance as possible.
- Hotel/Motel Rooms should have solid core or metal doors and an eye viewer.
- Always verify who's at your door. If you are not expecting a visitor, call the front desk if the person claims to be with the facility and do not open the door to strangers or solicitors.
- If you observe suspicious behavior notify hotel/motel personnel or call the police.
- Look for establishments that have the unit doors and walkways enclosed as well as electronic card access verses the outdated door key.
- Turn on the TV or radio when you are away from the room and leave a light on.
- Request a room closest to the main office avoid end units. Higher floors are preferred.
- Be aware of emergency exits and review with family members.
- Keep valuables in the hotel/motel safe or leave at home.
- Avoid carrying a purse whenever possible. Place money and credit cards in front pocket or jacket.
