Hello Friends & Neighbors,

According to the Albuquerque Police Department there has been a significant increase in criminal activity, particularly residential and auto burglaries in and around Taylor Ranch.

Please report ANY suspicious non-emergency activity via 242-COPS (242-2677) or 911 if an emergency. A non-emergency call is a situation where a person's life and/or property are not in immediate danger. Included under this definition are crimes against property, crimes against persons where the victim is not injured and offenders are not at or near the scene. An emergency call is defined as a situation where a person's life or property is in danger or threatened.

The Northwest Substation is located across the street from Cibola High School (4051 Ellison Ave NW) and their phone number is 505-768-4850.

Tips provided by APD include:

Ensure you have adequate illumination and/or motion sensor lights.

Trim bushes and shrubs to below window level.

Entrance doors should have 180-degree eye viewers.

Record make, model and serial number of all valuable property.

Engrave an ID number on the back of valuables (NOT your SSN).

Make a video of the contents of your home.

County Planning Commission (CPC) reviewing amendments for the County Zoning Code: On October 7th the County Planning Commission was scheduled to review several amendments being proposed for the County zoning code. One of the amendments being proposed was to add a requirement that there be a 500 ft separation between package liquor stores and residential properties. This is only for package liquor stores. I submitted a letter in support of the proposed 500 ft separation. I also made a suggestion that they remove a

sentence that says that the advisory design guidelines do not necessarily have to be followed by the developers. The CPC deferred the proposed amendments to the November 4th hearing, which starts at 9:00 a.m.

Sincere Appreciation: On December 1st, Councilor Cadigan will no longer be our City Council representative. We want to extend our appreciation for all the hard work he has done for Taylor Ranch and the Westside. He has been a strong advocate for the Westside by working to get more needed services, such as schools, police and fire facilities, libraries, and parks. He has helped to encourage quality development, preserve views along Coors, control the dust problem, preserve open space, build trails, and expand bus service such as the Rapid Ride. "CALL THE POLICE" — That was one of the pleas of Commander Warfield, chief of APD's NW Area Taylor Ranch Library isn't just for books! It offers Command. If you see or hear something that seems (and if you wish you can stay anonymous).

Remember: there were 23 residential burglaries, 7 auto burglaries, 7 auto-thefts, 4 aggravated assaults, 3 vandalisms and 62 suspicious persons/cars reported in the first 25 days of September in Taylor Ranch (plus a whole lot of disturbances).
