#### RECYCLING

We will pick up aluminum Saturday, August 7, the same day as the City's glass pick-up. Give the City your glass; give TRNA your aluminum. Last month, we made \$54.96. Remember, the money we collect will be used to beautify our streets.

Note that the City refuse picks up from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. We try to pick up from 8:30 to 11:00 so that we can get down to the dealer to sell the aluminum. If you can't get there by 11:00, just leave you aluminum with the refuse people and we will stop by and collect it around 2:30. If you are interested in helping, give me a call at 898-6228.

#### WILDFLOWER PROJECT

The wildflower project is the first major beautification project for the Environmental Committee. We began planting wildflower seeds on Montaño between Walgreen's and San Ildefonso on July 10th. The committee was joined by four able volunteers and we accomplished a lot. 
public officials and newsletter editors. Articles which violate these rules will not be printed (but may be kept for later use in the editor's memoirs). The decision of our judges maybe final.
