We submitted several things for awards, but only Monica was recognized as a "future leader". Monica tells me that she has a special project planned for next year that will be a sure winner.

Editor's Note




The Circle K Corporation won their appeal for a liquor license at the Golf Course Rd. & Paseo del Norte location.

proposals offered all include the entire LBJ attendance area. (the Taylor Ranch neighborhoods) in the Cibola High School district.

Kudos to LBJ Principal Marcie Johnson for leading the fight for much needed traffic control near LBJ and her innovative "Crime busters" program to stop vandalism and petty theft.

Crime Prevention



On the 18th of September TRNA put on a open forum on crime prevention for all 100 plus block captains in Taylor Ranch. Five captains showed up for the presentation. This is not a good turn out for the area. If we are to keep ahead of crime in this area then we need to be able to have a forum to disseminate information that is received. Meetings such as the on in September are the best way I know to do this. I strongly urge the block captains in Taylor Ranch to attend the next meeting.

On to other information. As of 30 June 1996, there have been 1,772 non-violent crimes committed in the Taylor Ranch area. This information comes from the crime statistics unit of APD. If this trend continues we will see about a one-third increase in crime in this area over last year!

Now the good news. The Chief of Police has informed TRNA that they will be participating in the **Communities On Phone Patrol (COPP)** program. This program brings pre-programmed cell phones into communities so citizen patrols can reach patrol units quicker if they see a crime in progress or someone needs help. We should feel honored to have been chosen out of all the applicants in New Mexico to participate in this program. When we find out how many phones will be distributed, we will select certain areas in Taylor Ranch where they will be used. More on this later.

As the holiday season is coming in like gang busters, we need to be more alert on the things we take for granted such as locking the house when we go shopping, locking the car in a mall parking lot, and being more



attentive to the people and situations around us. These things will slip our minds as we get tied up in the holiday spirit, so be careful and alert. That's all for this issue. Talk to you more in November.


