Message from the President. Doug Goodfellow

If you ask these questions, you should probably duck afterwards:

"Wow, is that a new haircut or did the hedge trimmers slip out of your hand?"

"Hey, when did you move your belt out another notch?"

"Would you mind moving? The sun's catching the back of your head and the glare is making it difficult for me to read!"

"Did you get your reappraisal and property tax bill?"

Especially the last one. I don't know exactly how much my property taxes went up; I'm rather afraid to look! On top of that, we've got Brad Allison, Superintendent for Albuquerque schools, making noise about a bond issue for school construction. Great timing, right?

A rually, I give the superintendent a lot of credit for having the cage to bring this issue up. Many of you probably read the articles regarding school size and the sub-par pace of school construction in this weekend's Albuquerque Journal. Since the last bond issue went down to flaming defeat, the school board has been extremely gun shy about asking for adequate levels of support for school construction from the voters. In the wake of the last reappraisals and mill adjustments, we've heard noise from several board members about this "not being a good time to bring up a bond issue."

Even given recent adjustments, though, Albuquerque property owners aren't asked to pay disproportionately large property taxes in relation to levies assessed in other southwestern and western cities. And I would argue that one of the main causes, if not the prime cause, lackluster performance Albuquerque's economy, and that of New Mexico in general and its continuing inability to attract industry and high paying jobs to this state is the woeful state of our schools. If we want a future for our kids in this state, we have to reassess and change our level of expectations and support for our schools.

So, while the timing of this issue is probably not the best it could be, I hope during the debate sure to arise over the next year or so on school bond issues, we all take a long view towards the future of our kids and our state and not stop our analysis at frustration over bad timing.

This holiday season, don't let the spirit of giving lull you into giving burglars, muggers, and pickpockets a better chance to do their dirty work. Crooks love the holidays as much as everyone else, but chiefly because it's an opportune time for crime.

Homes jam-packed with glittering gifts. Stores, malls and downtown streets teeming with unsuspecting shoppers. People rushing around, stressed out and careless, looking for last-minute gifts, trying to get everything done. It's enough to make a crook giddy with holiday joy.

Here are some tips on how to celebrate safely this holiday season:

IF YOU'RE TRAVELING

- Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your home, shovel snow, and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.


IF YOU'RE OUT FOR THE EVENING

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it 's like someone's home.
- De extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.
- Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

IF YOU'RE SHOPPING

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you.
- Park in a well-lighted space, and be sure to lock the car, close the windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a check or credit card whenever possible.
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Don't overburden yourself with packages. Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.
- Shopping with kids? Teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get rated.
