Dear Friends,

A number of years ago, British economist E.F. Schumacher wrote *Small is Beautiful*. In this surprisingly simple book, the author presented his theory that "bigness" is detrimental to effectiveness. He suggested that the level of complexity associated with increasing size results in breakdowns.

If you like you can experiment with this idea at the next social function you attend. Watch how conversation groups form. Initially one or two come together followed by several others joining in. When a group increases to five or six people, a split off will typically occur and two smaller groups will form. The process continues indefinitely.

Interestingly, one can hold "bigness" together through the use of structures and facilitation, for example the Arts in the Park event at the Mariposa Basin is an artificial structure with persons assigned to direct the process. So this "" "r" event can be facilitated, but it is not necessarily very effective from the Secridpoint of those involved.

The Taylor Ranch Neighborhood Association is an artificial structure that was created to act on the behalf of the residents of the community. It can do things which smaller groups may not be able to accomplish, but it will never be as effective as those individuals or groups. There is no good substitute for such small groups of individuals acting in their own best interests. Margaret Mead essentially confirmed this when she intimated that small groups of committed people can change the world.

We have ample experience with this in TRNA. Certainly the Youth Committee has demonstrated the extraordinary capacity of a relatively small group of young people. Every year small groups operating under the aegis of TRNA create the Easter Event, the Christmas Party and countless other activities.

It looks like TRNA does a great deal, but in fact it is small, affiliated groups which do the work of the organization.

I was particularly pleased at our last board meeting to see a group beginning to form around the adoption of Butterfield Park, formally knows as Riverview A, at the corner of Golf Course Road and Butterfield. In fact a group of two had already been taking care of the park, but they will now be expanding their impact by including others as the park officially becomes sponsored by TRNA. Once again TRNA will appear to be acting on behalf of the residents, but in fact is only the conduit allowing residents to act on their own behalf.

Our community will always have many needs as well as many people interested in satisfying those needs. I encourage you to identify those things which need attention, then to bring them forth to your Board of Directors. But please don't come with the expectation that we will solve your problem or address your issue. If we do our work well, we will aid you and others in dealing with it.

That is known as effective leadership and good stewardship. Better still, it keeps the solutions small and in the hands of those most adept at tending to them.
