

Editor's Note: Dogs are permitted in public places of the city (with the exception of public playgrounds and swimming pools) only if on a secure leash and in a person's control. Any animal found running at large on public property can be declared a public nuisance and can be impounded by an Animal Control Officer. The owner may be cited with violation of misdemeanor. The exception is Roosevelt Park where dogs may be exercised without a leash on certain days and times. Animal Control Ordinances, 9-2-2-3, 9-2-3-2 and Park Ordinance 10-1-1-7. Call 768-1975 for more info. Pet owners are required to pick up his/her dog's and cats' droppings. Animal Control Ordinance: 9-2-3-8. You can make a complaint to the Animal Services Division by calling 768-1975.

### ◆Frequent Neighborhood Concerns◆

Q: What can I do to see that the traffic laws are enforced in my neighborhood?

A: Call your local substation and ask to speak to the traffic unit. Give them information about the specific violations (e.g., speeding, running stop signs) and peak times, if any, that these violations are occurring. The police will evaluate the nature of the problem and have traffic and patrol officers monitor the area as well as provide stepped up enforcement. Since they pursue these reports on a first come, first served basis, they may not get to your neighborhood immediately. While the police may increase enforcement to catch violators, they cannot install stop signs or speed bumps in your neighborhood. (To find out the process for making physical changes in neighborhoods to deal with traffic problems, such as cut through and high volumes of speeding traffic, contact the Traffic Engineering Operations at 857-8680.)

Q: What do I do if my neighbor's home or car alarm goes off?

A: Call the police non-emergency number, 242-COPS, unless you think there is a life-threatening situation going on. In that case, call 911. If your neighbor keeps having false alarms, they can be cited and fined. Call the APD Alarm Ordinance Unit at 768-2059 if repeated false alarms are becoming a nuisance.

Q: What can I do if a neighbor is making too much noise (loud music, loud muffler, loud motorcycle)? A: To voice a noise complaint during business hours, call 768-2600. After hours you may call the Albuquerque Police Department at 242-COPS.

Presently, funding is being ested in the General Obligation Bonds currently undergoing review by the City Council.

Additional information on the Community Center is included in the newsletter, but here is a brief overview. The facility will be intended for intergenerational use with programming for seniors, youth, and families. It's 32,000 square feet will include a gym and fitness center, classrooms, computer rooms, and senior dining as well as outdoor play facilities. The projected cost is approximately \$7 million with \$4.2 million slated for specific bonding and another \$1 million to be provided by senior affairs bonding funds. Additional funds may be solicited from Bernalillo County monies or elegislature.

Meetings with the community will held this fall, though these will be principally addressing usage and functionality. In the meantime, please do your part to encourage our elected representatives to support the project.

On a final and unrelated note, it is with sadness that I advise you that I will resign from the Board of Directors by the time this newsletter reaches you. I am moving outside the bounds of Taylor Ranch and will no longer be eligible for membership.

Since 1990 I have been involved in TRNA. In some cases my activities were peripheral, but I had the great pleasure to spend two years revitalizing and rebuilding the Youth Committee as well as this short tenure as a member of the Board. This is a fine community with some extraordinary volunteers. Keep up the good work!®
