

#### News Notes From TRNA Board Meeting

The June meeting of the Taylor Ranch Neighborhood Association Board was held on June 15, 2005 at the Taylor Ranch Community Center. Among the items discussed, the board unanimously voted to approve a recommendation letter to the Albuquerque City Council to approve funding for the Taylor Ranch Community Center. The Board also unanimously approved a request from TRNA to the EPC for a deferral of the decision on the site plan for Andalusia North, so that neighborhood associations would have the opportunity to study and review the EPC approval requirements for this site.

The Board also unanimously approved support of Councilor Cadigan in establishing a moratorium on rezoning on-residential property to residential on the West Side. In other news, another flea market is in the works to provide funding for scholarships, with more information to come.

#### President's Message

TRNA's mission is to promote, preserve, and improve the quality of life in Taylor Ranch. This mission keeps your board members busy.

On June 4 we celebrated our 25th anniversary at Mariposa Basin Park. Everyone was having a good time until an uninvited guest made an appearance. A whirlwind tossed two large inflated kid jumps and an umbrella. Personnel from APD and AFD responded immediately and attended to the injured. We commend APD and AFD for their community outreach programs and the excellent service they provide to our community.

The board is following several new projects. A facilitated meeting will be held on July 7 to discuss the proposed Sonic at the corner of Coors and La Orilla. On June 21, 2005 developers presented a revised plan for the Fountain project. Nearby residents have concerns about some of the building heights and traffic through their neighborhoods. On June 16, 2005 the Environmental Planning Commission voted to approve a project of approximately 15 acres on the east side of Coors between Montano Road and Learning Road. The project was approved with 15 conditions ranging from floor area ratios to architectural design. For more information about development projects read the Land Use article.

Look for our new "Welcome to Taylor Ranch "signs. The signs will be installed on Montano and Golf Course Road. These signs replace signs that were removed long ago.

Many of you may know that Lieutenant Ed Perea has retired from APD after 24 years of service. Lt. Perea has been an asset to the Westside and especially Taylor Ranch. Lt. Perea involvement in our community has taught us that we are better together. We will miss him, but we wish him the very best of luck in his retirement.

# TRNA's 25th Anniversary Celebration

Well we made a little bit of history Friday and Saturday June 3th and 4th respectively.

On Friday night we had a reception for the members of the Taylor family, former board members of TRNA, and local elected officials. Music was provided by a volunteer harpist, Linda Kennedy and some delicious food was prepared by the kitchen staff of Pin Seekers. The history board prepared by Ken Newman was displayed. The crowd of about 65 had a good time. (Later the next week the history board was put out in the community center for all to enjoy and later parts of the board were placed in the permanent glass display case in the hall.)

Saturday morning started at six am. Volunteers were at work at six fifteen. The exhibitors set up their info tables and other volunteers were setting up the signs, games and food booths. The sound system was tested and by 10 am we were ready for the opening ceremony.

There were people everywhere: in the parking lot were the antique cars, the climbing rock, and the strong presence of the Albuquerque Police Department: Crime Prevention, Recruiting, Traffic, DWI, Mobile Command Post, Bomb Squad (the dancing robot was a great success). There were several units from the Sheriff's department and the Albuquerque Fire Department was LAO out in force with Fire Prevention and ladder and rescue vehicles.

Then at about 10 after 1pm, Mother Nature stepped in and threw a tamper tantrum. We weren't expecting that. All the public safety officers on hand took over and looked after people who needed care. After a delay, the scheduled karate demonstration took place on a grassy field in the playground area and the rest of the performances were held outside the community center.

After the event, I got a number of e-mails and phone calls from people expressing their thoughts about the day. Despite Mother Nature's damage, they were all positive about the value of the community celebration. The hard work of all our volunteers made many people happy!!
